# **Dropping off and Picking Up**

Please can I remind parents that unless they have a disabled badge, parents and carers should not bring cars into the carpark.

If you do have a badge and need to park, you will be asked to wait until children have left the Academy.

#### Sickness

We do have a small amount of sickness in some areas of the Academy. Please can I remind you that if your child has been sick, they must remain at home for 48 hours, whatever the circumstances. Sickness bugs are highly contagious, and we need to make every effort to minimise the risk of infection.

# **Pupil Premium**

You may be aware that households who have an income of less than £16,000 a year are entitled to claim for free school meals. However, you may not be aware that once this has been agreed, the Academy will receive extra money per child so that we can provide clubs at no cost to yourselves and we can subsidise trips and enrichment activities.

We will send out forms next week and if you think that your child may be eligible, please can we ask that you complete the form and return it to the office at your earliest convenience.

If you have any coats or winter clothing that your children have grown out of, we would welcome donations so that we can pass them onto other families who may benefit from these items.
