# Toy timeline: 1950s toys



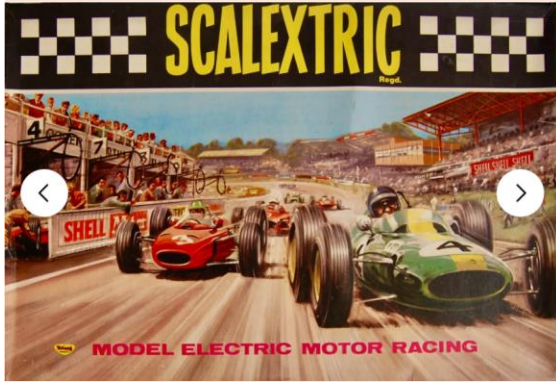
Children loved playing with hula hoops.

Many children enjoyed playing with construction toys.





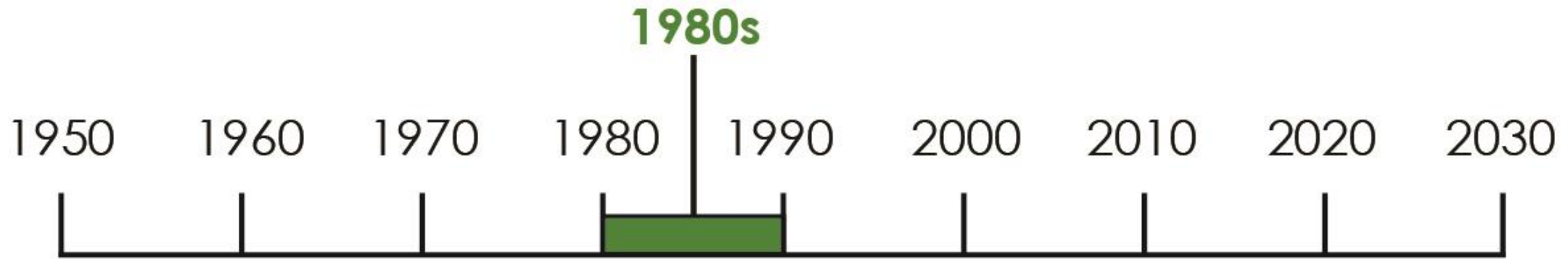
