What is the monastic life?

What does Jesus say in the Bible about poverty?

How do Christians act on this at home and abroad?

In the last three lessons we looked at:

- *What does Jesus say in the Bible about poverty?*
- *How do Christians act on this at home and abroad?*

Today we are going to look at how some Christians act on this in their own lives. In particular, a practice called **asceticism**.



Asceticism means giving up on life's luxuries and denying yourself some pleasurable parts of life for religious reasons.

In Christianity some people feel called to live an ascetic life and give up a life of comfort and luxury to live a life of simplicity, prayer and helping others. This choice of life is called **monastic** life.



Men who choose this path are called **monks** or **friars** and they live in a **monastery** or **friary**.



Women who choose this path are called **nuns** and they live in a **nunnery** or **convent**.



There are lots of different types of monastics. We are going to focus on Franciscans who are inspired by the life of St Francis - a man who lived 1,000 years ago and gave up a life of luxury to build a church, help the poor, look after animals and live a life of prayer.

Franciscans take three **vows** (promises) when they become friars - they make these promises for life.

Poverty
Chastity
Obedience

They tie their robes up with a piece of rope with three knots - each knot reminds them of a vow. Let's look in more detail at the vows.



Poverty

- Friars do not own any property – all the clothes, technology, food, houses etc. that they need to live is owned by the collection of friars.
- Friars agree to live simple lives without luxury. Any money they earn must go to help others and to charity.

Chastity

- Friars agree to not have a boyfriend or girlfriend and to not pursue any kind of marriage. They remain single and focus their life on prayer and service.

Obedience

- Friars promise to live by the Bible and follow the rule of their community and of the senior Friars.
- It doesn't mean they have to follow orders even when they are wrong or will cause pain but they have to be well-behaved and orderly.
