A **promise** is an agreement to do or not do something.



Andeep

When we play football we have to agree to the rules of the game so that everyone knows what to do. If we all **promise** to keep to the rules, the game is fair for everyone.

I made an important Brownie **promise** when I joined Brownies. I **promised** to do my best to help other people and to do a good deed every day.

People sometimes use symbols to represent serious **promises**.

When I made my Brownie **promise**, I was given a special **promise** badge to wear on my Brownie uniform.

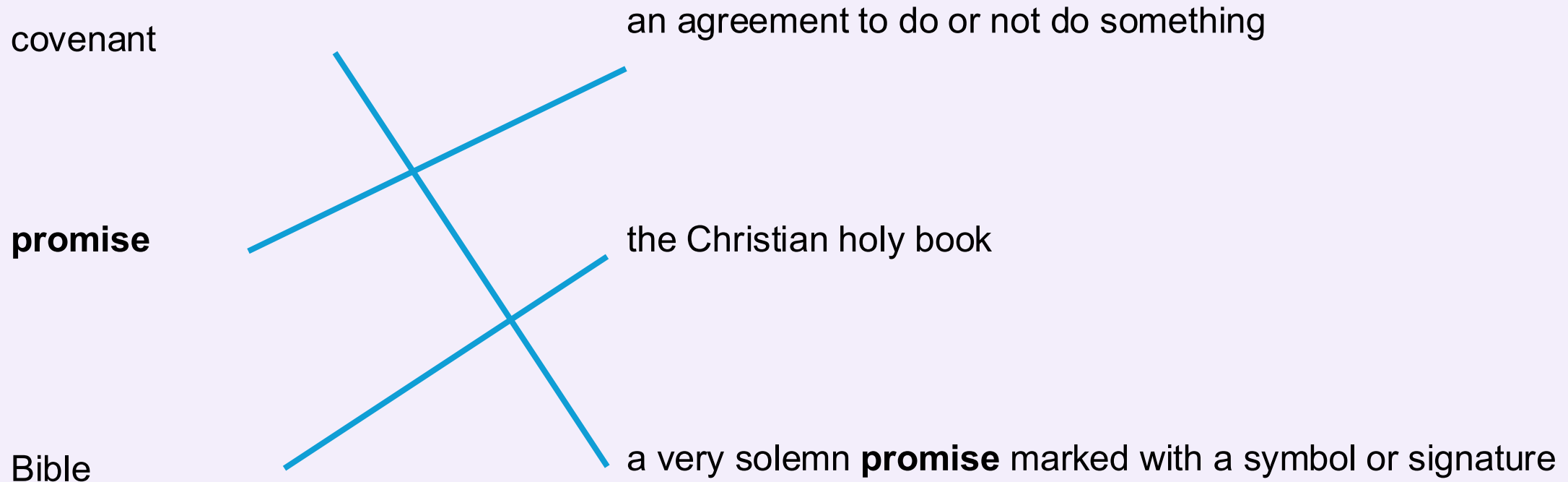

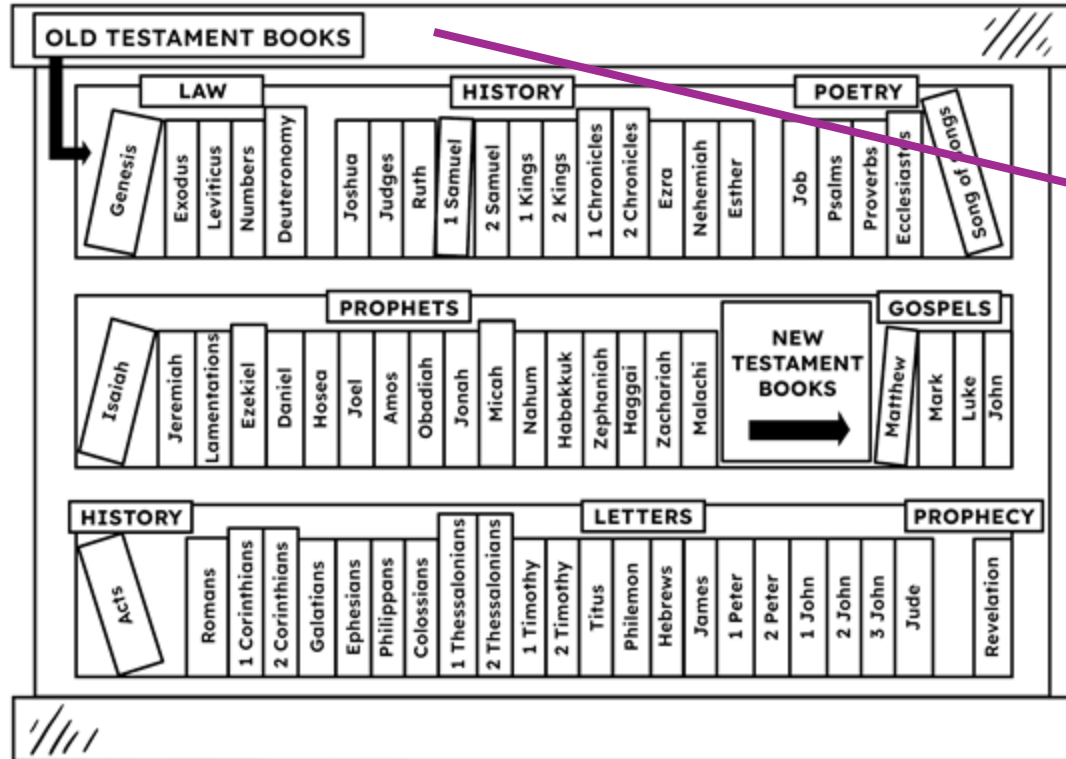

The Bible has two parts. The first part is called the **Old Testament**.

The **Old Testament** was written over 2000 years ago, before the time of Jesus.

Jews and Christians share the books of the **Old Testament**.

Fiona describes the **Old Testament**.

The stories at the very beginning of the **Old Testament** are the same as the stories in the Jewish holy book, the **Torah**.

I sometimes talk about these ancient shared stories with my Jewish friends.

Fiona explains more about the **Old Testament**.

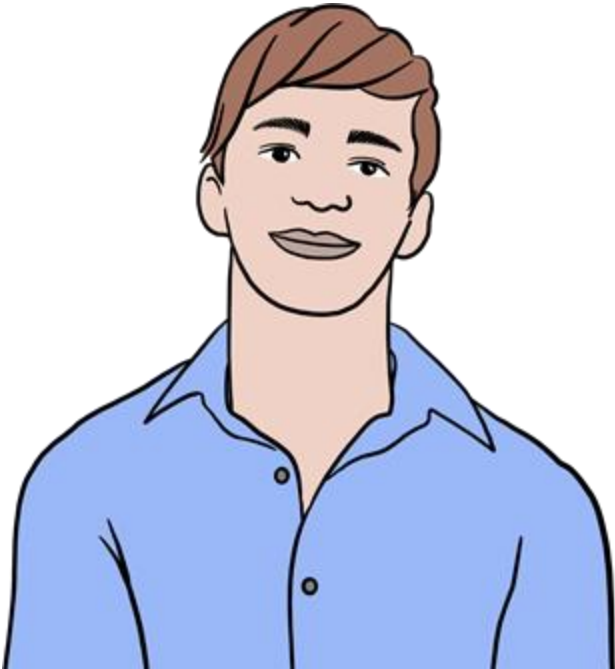


Fiona

Charlie explains more about the stories in the **Old Testament**.

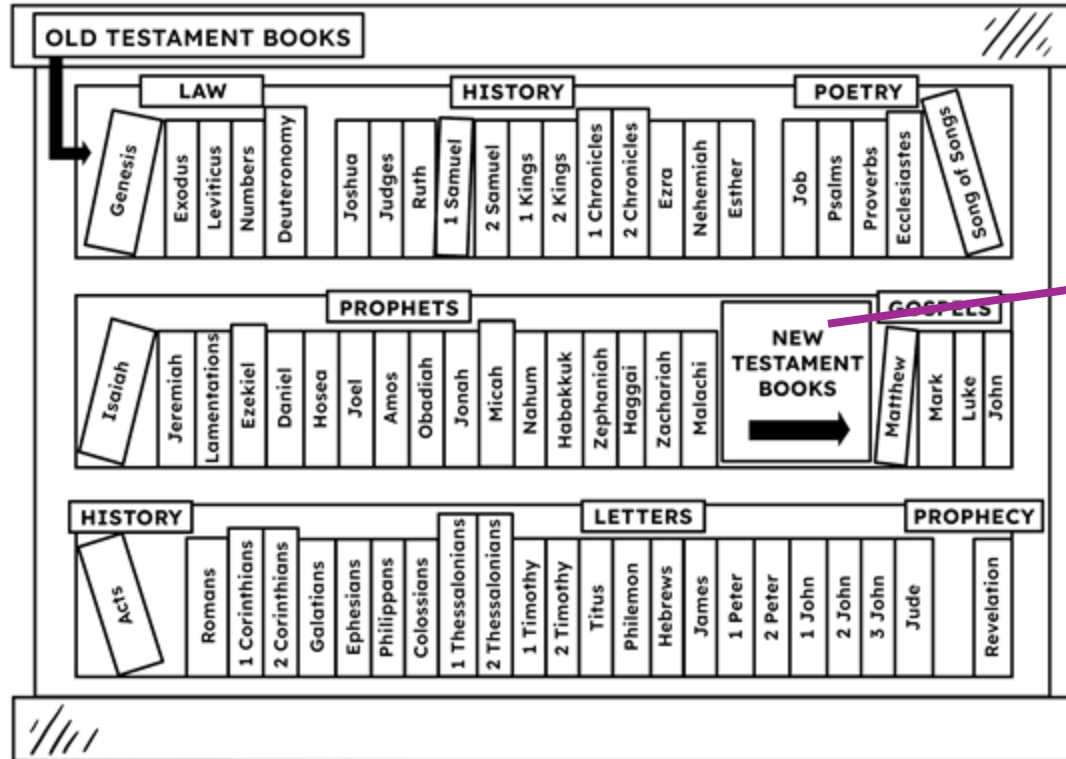


Charlie

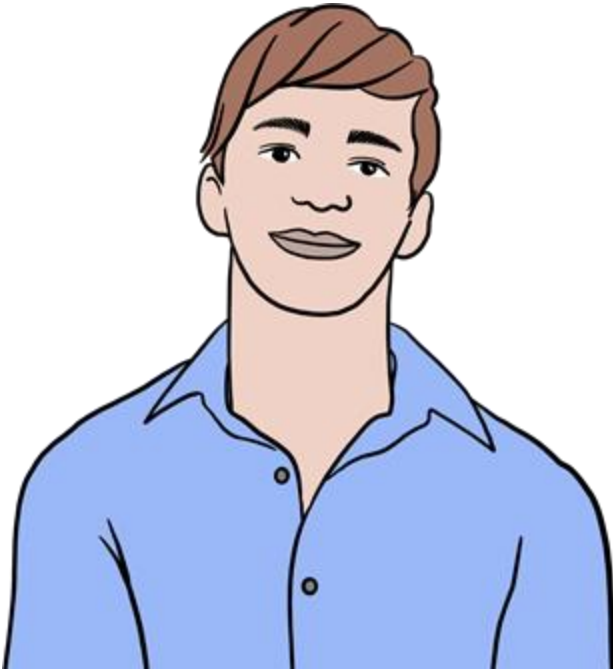

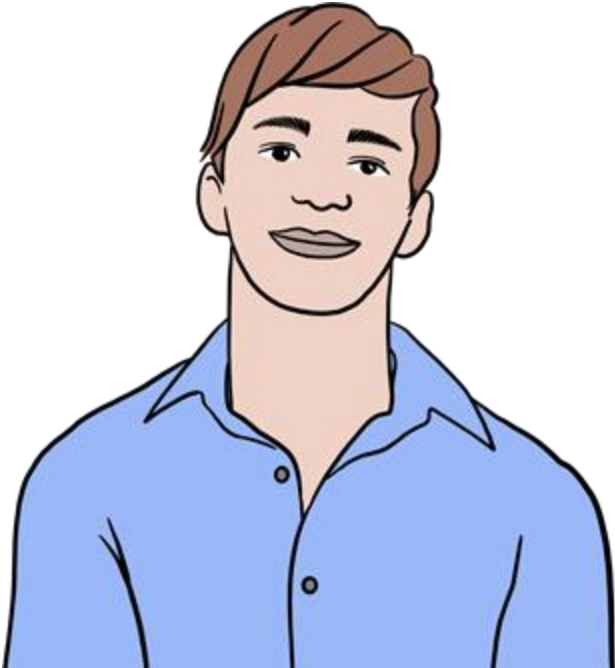

The Bible is like a library full of different kinds of books written by different people. It has two parts.

The Bible is made up of lots of different books. It has an **Old Testament** and a **New Testament**.

There are important shared stories with **promises** in for Christians and Jews. The stories are in the Jewish **Torah** and the Christian Bible.

The Bible has two '**testaments**': the **Old Testament** and the **New Testament**. The word '**testament**' means a solemn **promise** by God.

The **Old Testament** is made up of writings about Jewish tradition and beliefs. These are also sacred to Jews today.

The **New Testament** records the life and teachings of Jesus and his earliest followers. These are sacred to Christians today.

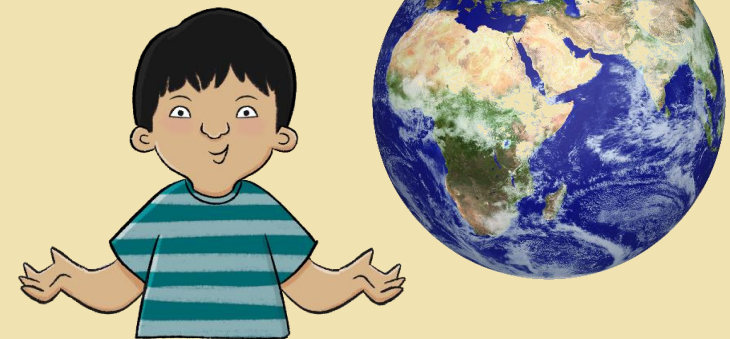

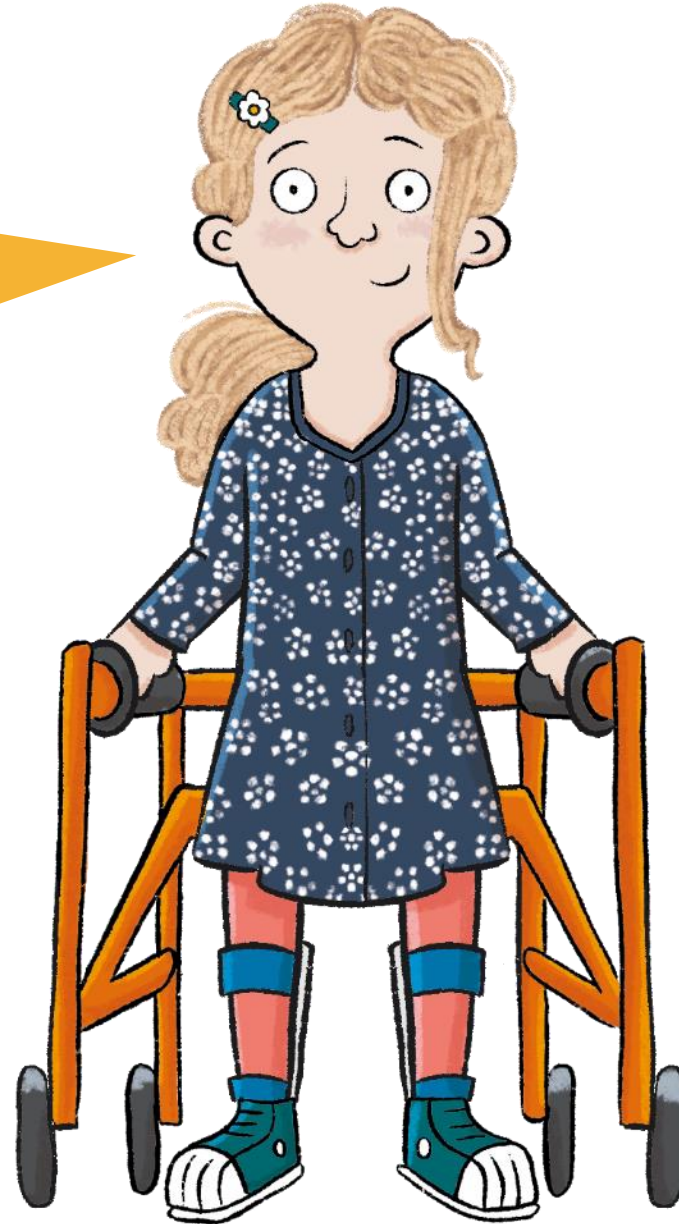

Planet Earth

Earth is special because it is the only planet we know of that has life. On Earth, the conditions for life are just right—not too hot or cold, not too wet or dry.

Earth is a big sphere (like a round ball) covered in **land** and water.

Planet Earth

A **globe** shows where there is land and water on planet Earth. A globe is similar to a map, except maps are flat and globes are round.

Why might a globe be better than a map?



What is a continent?

Planet Earth is made up of seven **continents** and five **oceans**.

A continent is a very large area of land. A continent is often separated from other areas of land (other continents) by water, or another feature such as mountains.

The seven continents on Earth are: Africa, Antarctica, Asia, Europe, Oceania, North America, and South America.



What is a continent?

What is the difference between a **continent** and a **country**?

A **continent** is a large landmass separated by ocean or mountains.

A **country** is found within a continent and separated by government borders and are ruled by different people.





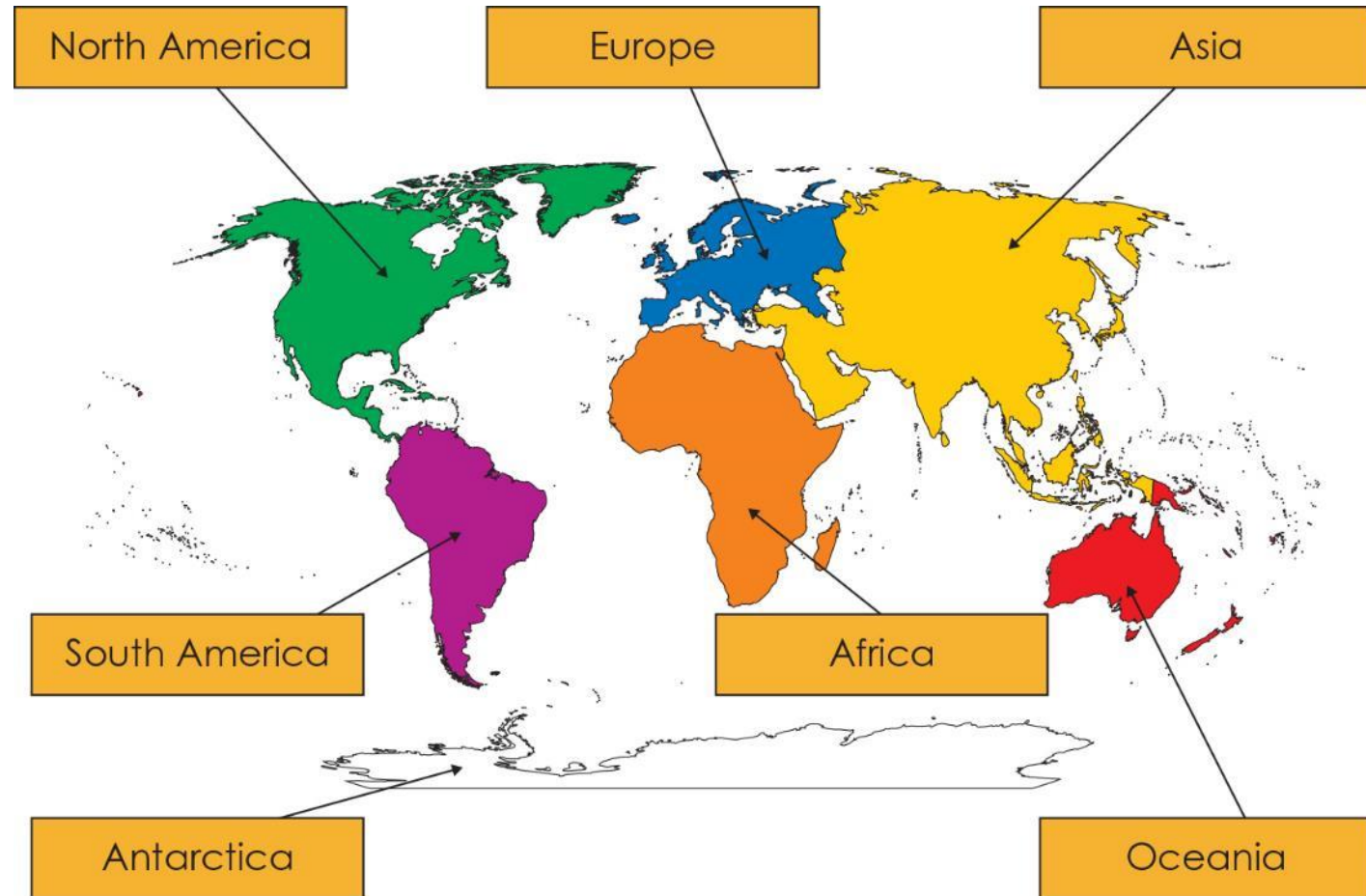
