Measuring straight and curvy lines

Measuring straight and curvy lines

- Which line in each pair is longer?





I estimate the curved line is longer.

Measuring with a ruler, the straight line is about eight cm long.

The curved line is **longer than** the straight line.

I estimate the straight line will be longer.

Measuring with string and a ruler, the curved line is about nine cm long.

The straight line is **shorter than** the curved line.

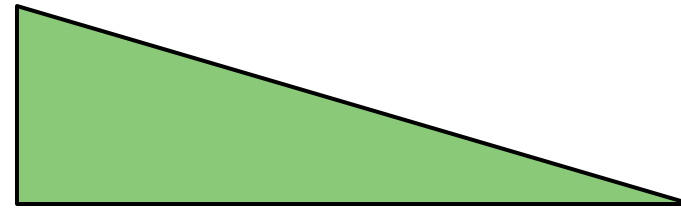
