





Q. What is the weather and climate like in the UK?

The weather in the UK can be different depending on where you are! In the south of England, it is usually warmer and sunnier. The middle of the country, like the Midlands, can have a mix of sunshine and rain. In the north of Scotland, the weather is often colder and can be very windy. The west of the UK, especially around Wales, often has more rain, while the east is drier. The weather can change a lot, so it's important to always check the forecast!





Plot a graph of your own results




1. How are your results similar to the results from Hexham?

Use this map to write an explanation of how the temperature differs across the UK.


