Using Prepositions in a Newspaper Report

Prepositions help the reader understand **where** and **when** events happened. In a newspaper report, they make the information clearer and more detailed. Prepositions can show where the children were seen, where the event took place, or when something happened. For example: *"near the tunnel," "inside the entrance," "before lunchtime."* These small words help the reader picture what happened and understand the facts more easily.

- 1) Why are prepositions used in a newspaper report?**

Indirect speech-

Indirect speech is when we report what someone said without using their exact words. We do not use speech marks.

Example:

Rose screamed that she wanted Jack to come out of the tunnel, the construction worker reported.

Direct speech-

Direct speech is when we write the exact words someone said. We use speech marks.

Example:

The construction worker reported that Rose shouted, "I want Jack to come out of the tunnel."

Direct and indirect speech:

This will be integrated throughout your report

- At least **one sentence of direct speech** from a witness
- At least **one sentence of indirect speech**
- Clear facts about what was seen or heard
- Prepositions to show **where** and **when**

Speech from witnesses (direct and indirect)
