

Modality is used to indicate the degree to which something is certain, possible or improbable. Using high modality words in persuasive writing is a great way to convince your reader that your point of view is the correct one!

I am certain that erasing the lighthouse will make no difference to the Germans who can use other landmarks to navigate.

TBAT: use persuasive devices.

Exaggeration is a common technique used in persuasive writing, such as newspaper articles, to get points across to the reader and evoke a more emotional response. The writer intentionally uses exaggeration to make the reader consider the size of the issue!

Facts are used to support your argument in a persuasive letter. Facts make the text seem authoritative, accurate and therefore believable.


