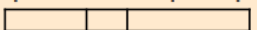

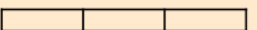

Why is he puzzled?

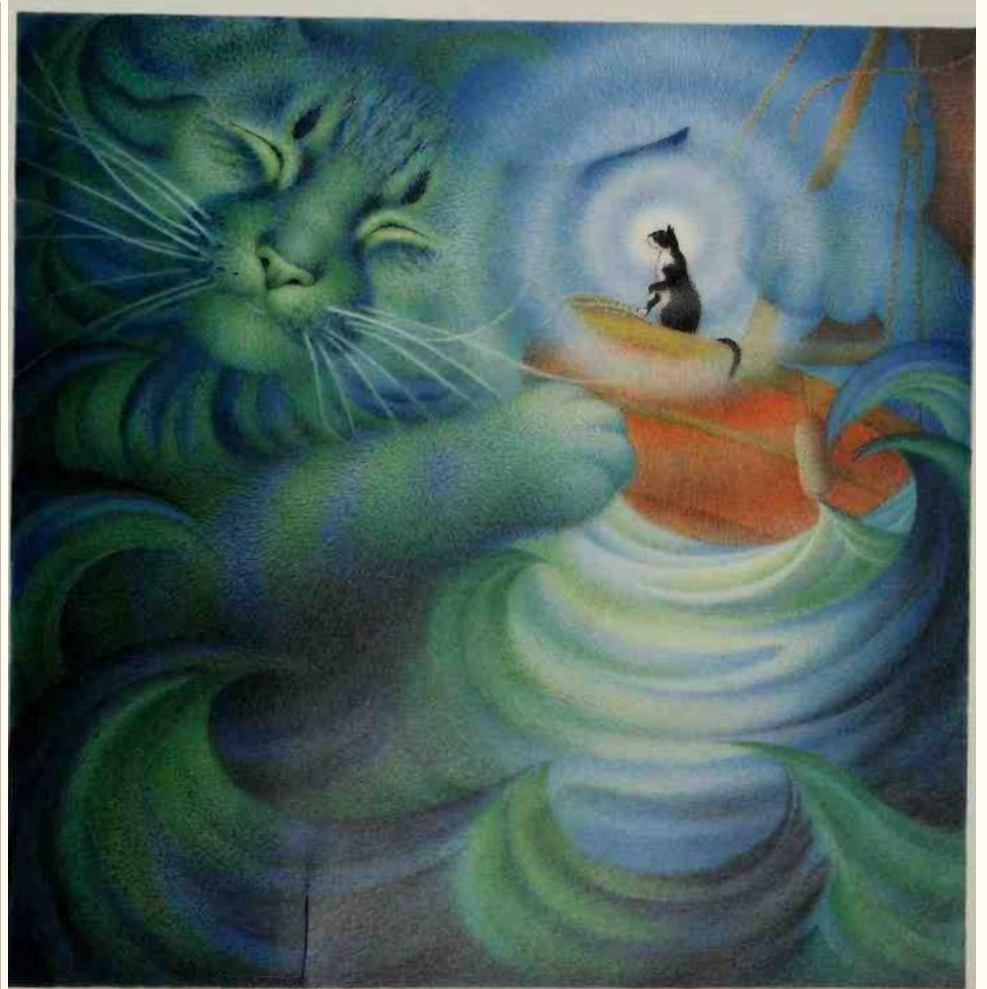

Then the Great Storm-Cat began to purr with Mowzer, and as the soft sound grew, the winds waned and the waves weakened.

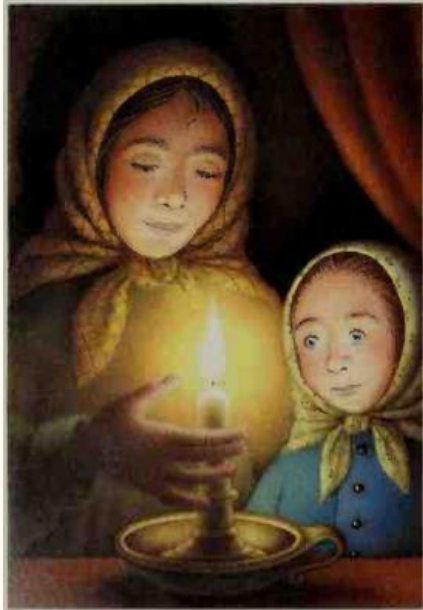

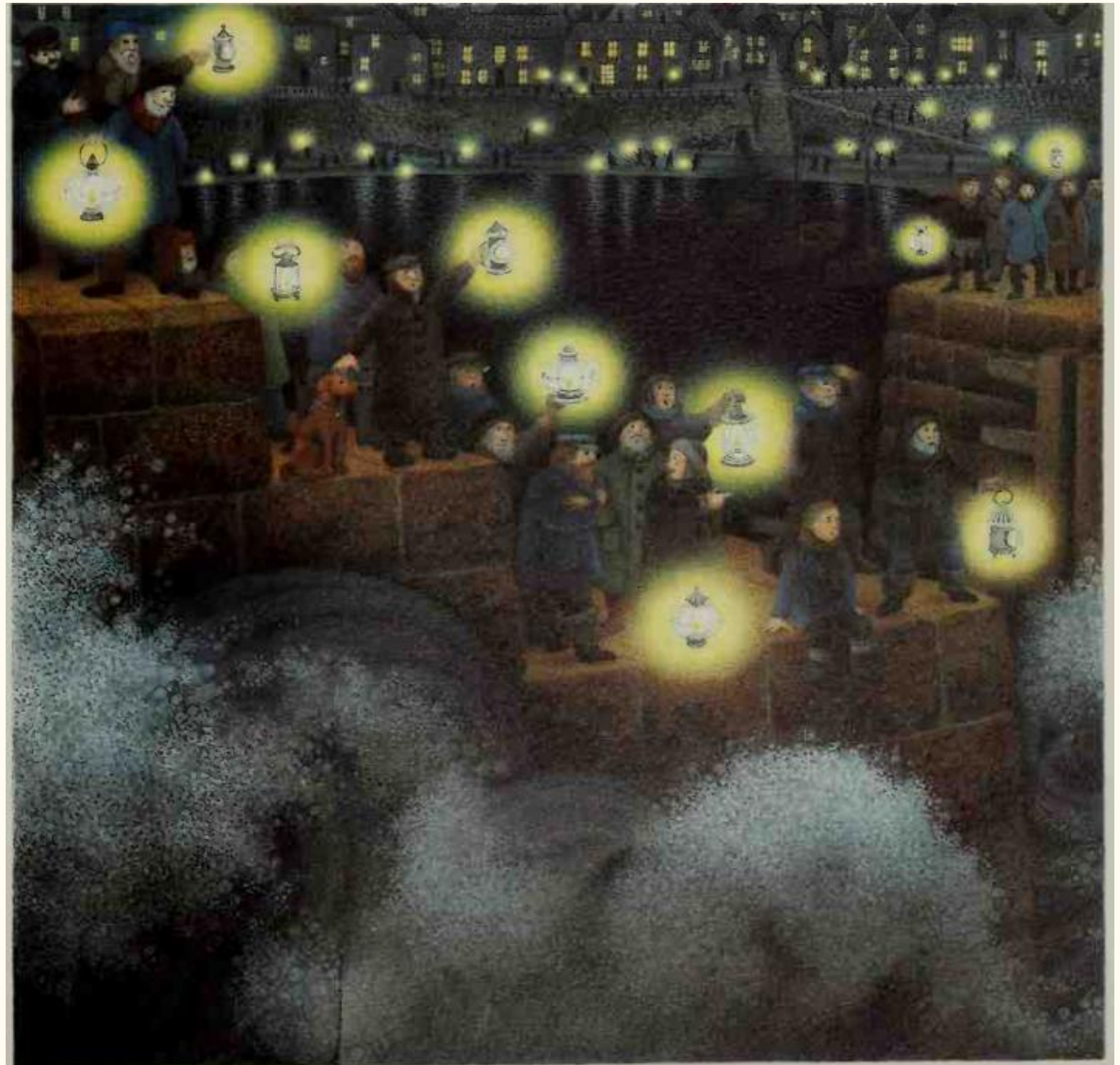

For when the people of Mousehole had woken to find old Tom's boat missing and a light left in his window, they knew that he had gone out to find fish for them, or to perish on the deep water.

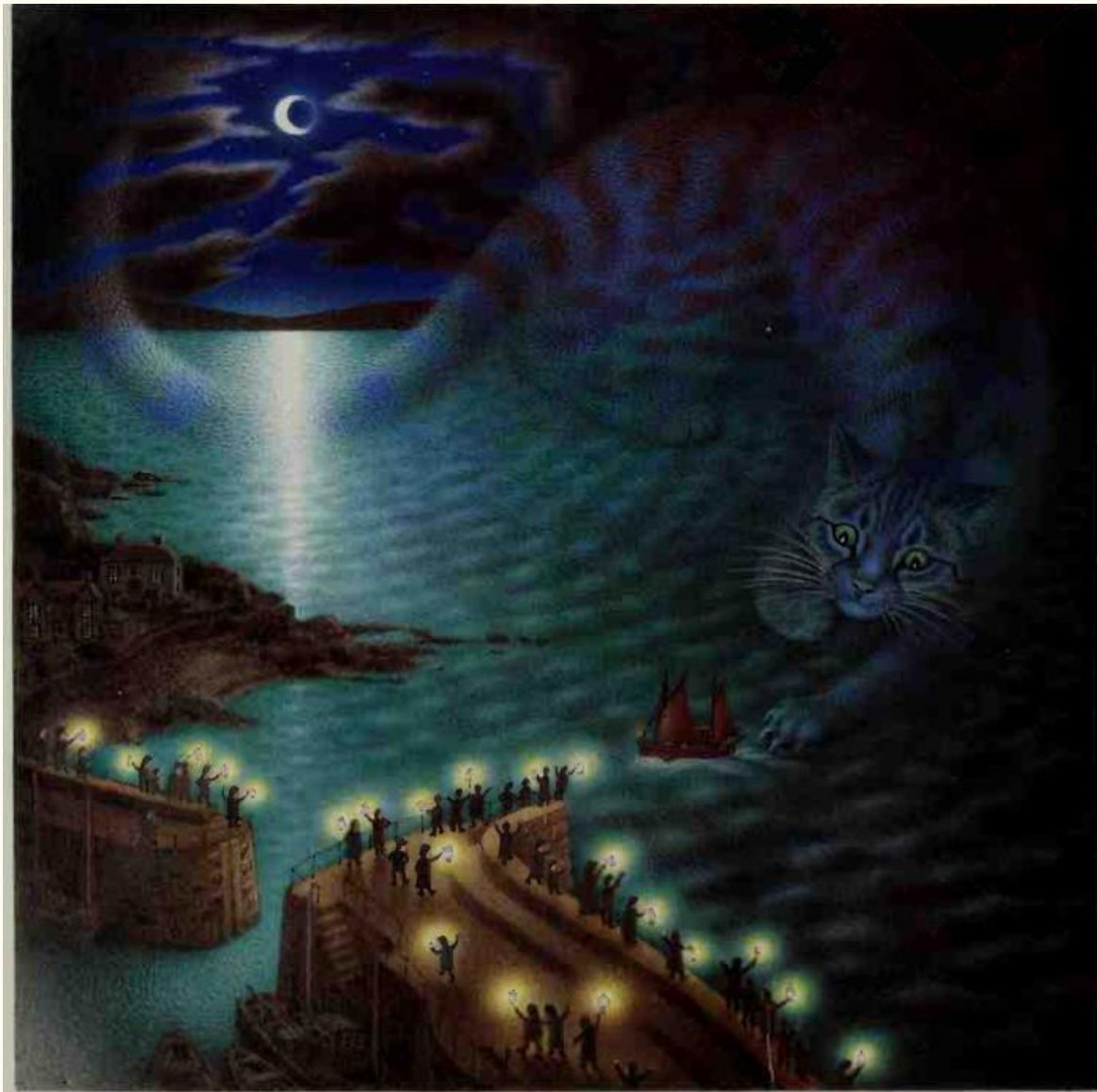


All day they had watched and waited, staring out into the cloud-wracked sea, but they could see no sign of him.

And when night fell, the women went home and set candles in all their windows and every man lit his lantern and went down to the harbour walls.



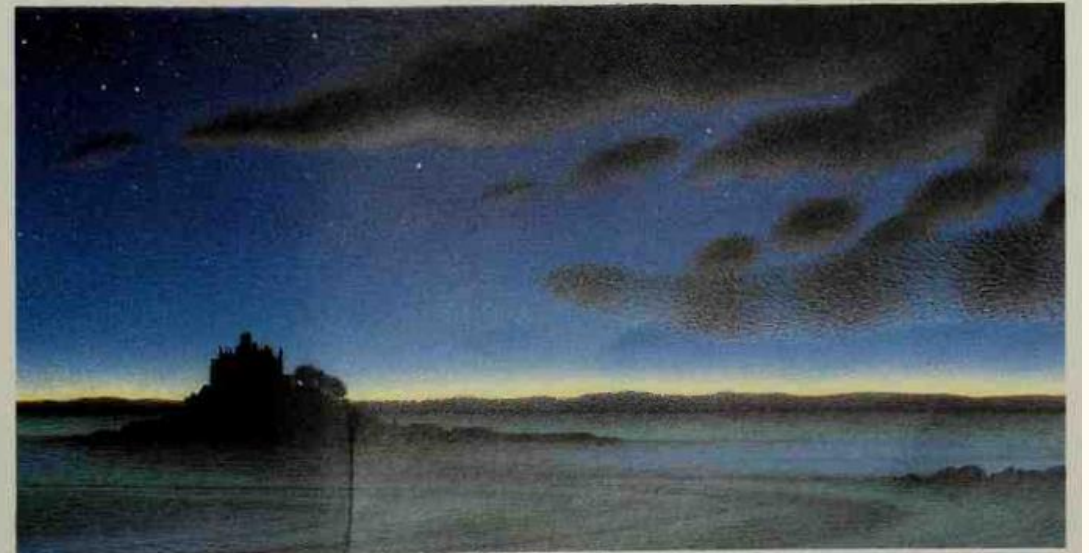
What has the storm cat done? What created the final breeze?

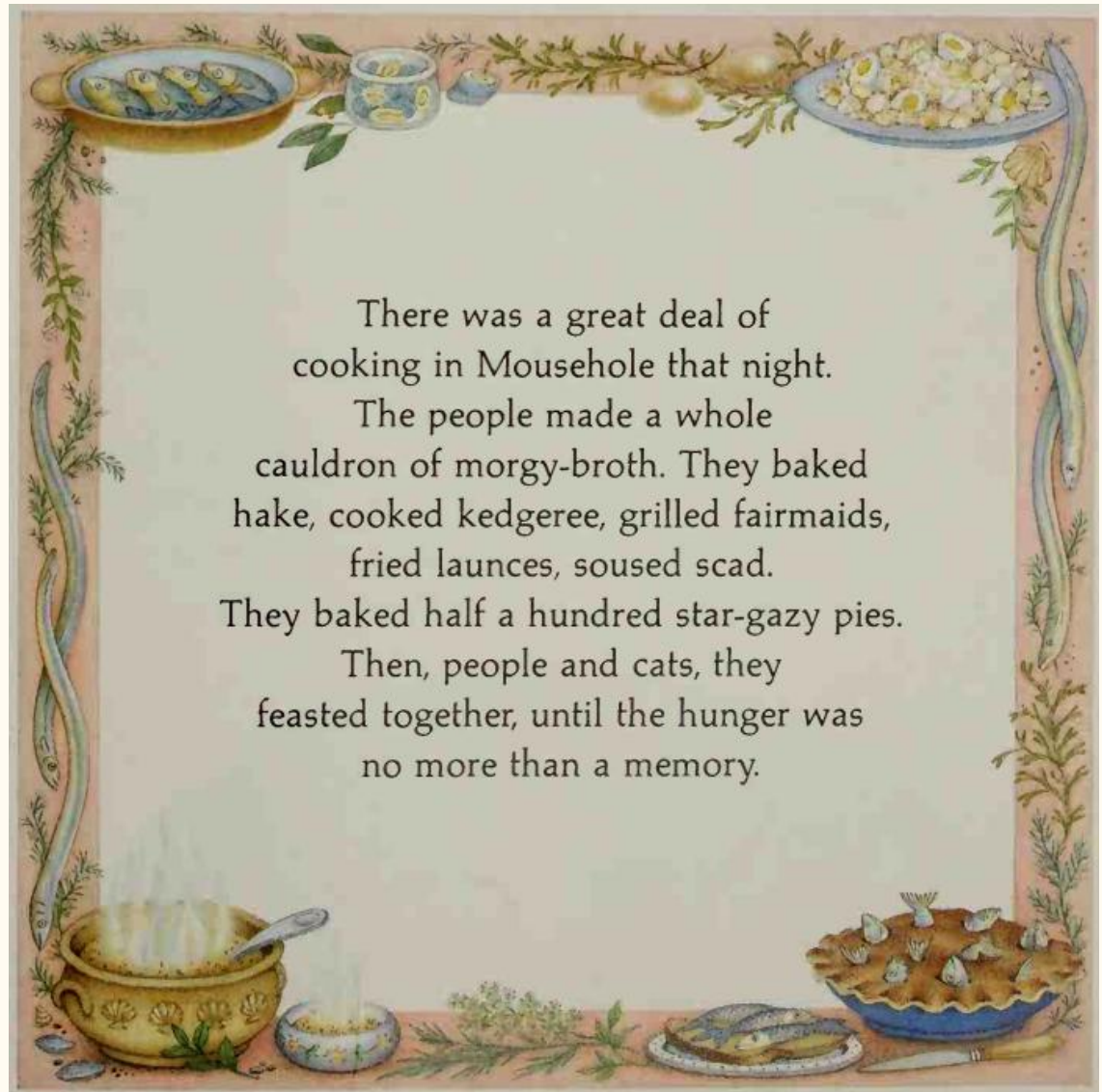
As old Tom and Mowzer came through the Mousehole gap, a sudden breeze caught them, a tiny, playful cat's paw, like a gesture of farewell.

How we get rocks from Earth.



First, we find a suitable quarry which contains natural rock.



We use diggers and sometimes dynamite to quarry the rock from the ground.



The natural rock is then loaded into huge trucks.



This natural material is taken to a factory or stone mason to be used.
