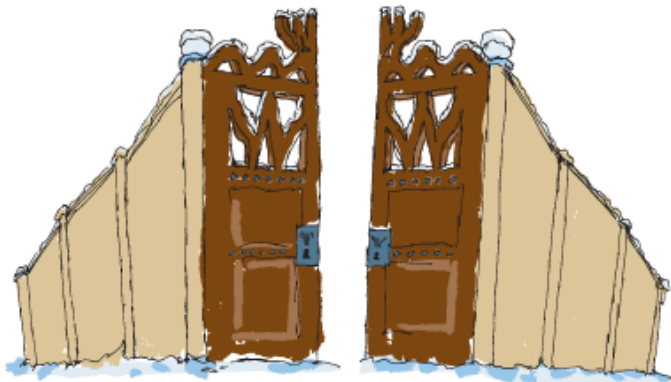


WONKA'S FACTORY
